Dear Mr. President,

Abolition of nuclear weapons and realization of eternal peace is the earnest wish of the people of Japan, the only nation in the world which suffered from the atomic bombings. It is also a sincere wish of the 9 million citizens of Kanagawa Prefecture.

It was announced by your country that the new type of subcritical nuclear tests had been conducted during the period between October and December last year.

It is hardly understandable that, while voices of protest against nuclear tests are being raised in the international society, your country continues nuclear tests. With this background, we can not but question your vision of a world without nuclear weapons.

The tests have been carried out and later revealed through the media. This has been repeated in spite of our continued protest, and we feel strong resentment against the fact.

In order to achieve nuclear disarmament and everlasting peace of the world, the Kanagawa Prefectural Government and all the municipalities within the prefecture hereby express our opposition against all forms of nuclear tests by any

country. We strongly request that your country, as a responsible nuclear state, never conducts nuclear tests in the future.
