A private railway full of local energy, lovingly known as "Enoden". While the line is short at only 10 km in length, you can see mountains and the sea along the route, and you can also catch glimpses of Enoshima and Mount Fuji. The many picturesque locations along the route are quite charming. It travels along the Shonan coast, in between houses in residential areas, and also in the middle of a street. It is great as a means of getting to all the tourist spots.

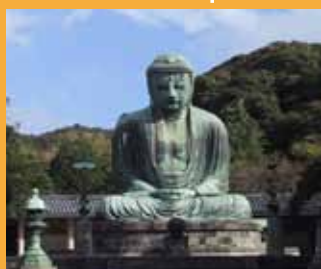

**Kotoku-in Temple and the Kamakura Great Buddha**



This Great Buddha is mentioned in poems by Akiko Yosano. It stands at over 13 m tall including the pedestal, and is the only registered Japanese National Treasure in Kamakura.

**Kamakura Museum of Literature**



The former Kamakura villa of Marquis Maeda, completed in 1936. You can see many valuable articles here of Yasunari Kawabata and other related authors, set in rooms that remind us of a time gone by with their marble stoves, stained glass, and more. The gardens boasts 250 rose plants that burst into full bloom in Spring and Autumn.
