Odawara Castle



Odawara Castle was the residence of the Hojo Clan, which ruled Kanto during the Warring States period. It is widely known for the plum trees, cherry blossom, hydrangea, and other flowers within the park. The exhibits were also recently renewed after the completion of major renovations of the castle keep.

Odawara-juku Nariwai Koryukan Tourist Rest House



An old textile wholesale store constructed in 1932 was redeveloped as a "resting area" where anyone could drop by and as a place to announce citizen-initiated activities. The event space on the second floor is used as a place for many citizens and tourists to interact.
