Kaiseimachi Hydrangea Festival



Explanation of
Tourist Attraction

Kaiseimachi located on route from Tokyo/Yokohama to Hakone/Odawara. It is famous for its hydrangeas. About 5000 hydrangeas are planted alongside farm roads and waterways running through 17 ha. of rice fields. The flowers perfectly match the rural landscape completely colored in green. Hydrangeas in Kaiseimachi can be seen from early to mid-June. Many events are held at the nearby "Ashigari-go Seto Mansion" (old Japanese-style house built approx. 300 years ago).

Ashigari-go "Seto Mansion"



Seto Mansion is a 300 year old Japanese-style house. Traditional Japanese annual events such as Hinamatsuri, Tango no Sekku, Tanabata are held there.

Odawara Castle (25 minute drive from Kaiseimachi)



Odawara Castle was the residence of the Hojo Clan, which ruled Kanto during the Warring States period. It is widely known for the plum trees, cherry blossom, hydrangea, and other flowers within the park. The exhibits were also recently renewed after the completion of major renovations of the castle keep. 0465-23-1373
