

# STUDY IN KANAGAWA

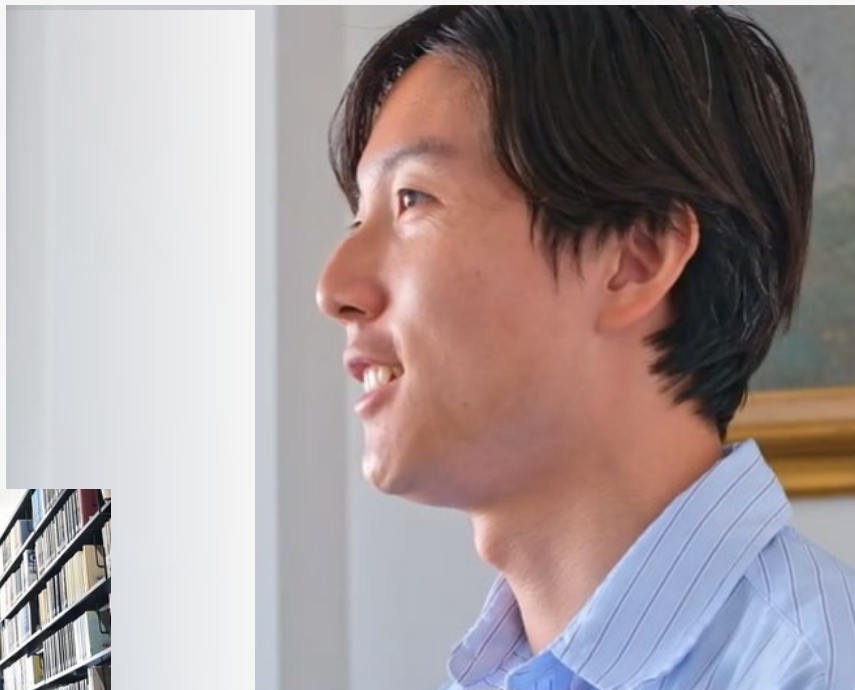
## Student Interview

An interview with **Liu Qingquan**, currently studying at Yokohama National University. Let's hear his insights and experiences about studying abroad in Kanagawa.

## “Studying abroad is about more than just studying”

Studying and research are, of course, very important, but life is not solely about academics. He shared that even within a limited period of time, students should make the most of their study-abroad experience by taking time to explore different places.

He also spoke about how to balance academic life with daily living, as well as the many appealing aspects of life in Kanagawa.

#### What are you studying at university?

I am researching the concept of worker status within labor law. For example, my research looks at whether food delivery couriers and self-employed or freelance workers should be considered employees or not.

#### How do you feel about job hunting in Japan?

One of the distinctive and appealing aspects of Japan's recruitment system is that people can challenge themselves in a wide range of fields, even if those fields are not directly related to their academic major.

In addition, there are various job-hunting support programs for international students. This year, I participated in a discussion session organized by KANAFAN, which was an enjoyable experience as it provided an opportunity to exchange ideas and engage in discussions with people from diverse backgrounds and fields.
