Kannonzaki Park

Nature, History, Culture, View

The park occupies almost the whole area of Cape Kannon (Kannonzaki) jutting out into Tokyo Bay. Here you will find many ways to enjoy the beauty of the vicinity, for example watching ships slowly crossing the narrow Uruga-suido Channel, or walking around in a forest with abundant vegetation that spreads over the hilly cape. The vicinity encompasses popular attractions including Kannonzaki Lighthouse, which is Japan's first western-style lighthouse, Kannonzaki Natural Museum, and Yokosuka Museum of Art, a uniquely-designed art sphere built to mark the 100th anniversary of Yokosuka City.

Inamuragasaki

An ancient battlefield where a great samurai commander threw his sword in the sea.

A famous legend tells of the samurai commander Nitta Yoshisada who, upon attacking Kamakura, threw his golden sword into the sea and moved on with his forces to attack the city after the waters parted for him. From here, Enoshima Island lies on top of Shichirigahama Beach, with Mt. Fuji in the background of and a panoramic view of the mountains of Izu. Especially beautiful during sunset.

Zushi Area



Zushi Beach

Beautiful half-mile-long beach that attracts numerous visitors each season with its different lights and delights.

The beach, stretching as far as your eyes can follow, also has a wide sand land area behind. It attracts not only swimmers but also water sports lovers like windsurfers because of its safe and calm slow tidal current condition. The beach is one of Zushi City's most popular spots because it stages lots of events like "Yabusame" (mounted archery on horseback).

Miura Area

Jogashima Prefectural Park/Jogashima Island

The spring arrives to the park earlier than any other parts of the prefecture.



The prefectural park is located at the southern-most point of Miura Peninsula. You will notice the height of vegetation inside the park is mostly low, for the park is always washed by wind from the Pacific Ocean. In January, 700,000 narcissuses bloom, and in June hydrangea attract visitors' eyes. On a sunny day there is a chance to see as far as Boso Peninsula or Izu Peninsula. We also recommend a visit to Umanose-Domon (Sea Cave).

Located on a hilly area in the middle of the Peninsula, "Shonan Village Center, Lodging-training facility in lush greenery" aims at promoting four main cosmopolitan outlooks; "research," "encouragement of talent," "technological exchange" and "cultural exchange." On the edge of the Village is a hill commanding a fine view of Mt. Fuji rising up over Sagami Bay; about 70,000 azaleas can be enjoyed in the springtime (late April to early May).
