Set in "Yokosuka, the Maritime City," we will hold a performance of traditional performing arts rooted in the life of the Miura Peninsula. The program includes the UNESCO-intangible cultural heritage "Chakkirako", the 300-year-old "Tora Odori" (Tiger Dance), and "Kainan Shrine Men-Kagura" a silent masked performance dedicated to Kainan Shrine. A special highlight is a joint Ameya Odori performance, featuring its original troupe from Chiba, "Shiramasu Konaya Odori," alongside local performers from the Miura Peninsula performers.
